In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act preserving special needs trusts for disabled seniors.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

- 1 SECTION 1: Section 28 of chapter 118E of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 inserting at the end thereof the following paragraph:-
- 3 A transfer of resources to a special needs trust that conforms to 42 USC \$1396p(d)(4)(C)
- 4 established solely for the benefit of a disabled individual of any age shall not be treated as a
- 5 disposal of resources for less than fair market value.
